Journey through the service

- National specialist centre for rare inherited metabolic disorders
- Clinical review takes place via a secure video-link in Bradford
- Consultants decide who is appropriate for the service
- Advanced practitioner and specialist nurse with the patient, consultant via video link
- Community learning disability nurse support at the clinic
- Reasonable adjustments in place
- Investigations to take place at SRFT

Service Developments

- Advanced Practitioner led clinic
- Full day clinic once a month
